
Progress Check Building Community through Health, Recreation and Wellbeing

- Major renovations of the village room, a flexible space that hosts community clubs including for Art, Sewing, Social groups, Local History, Wellbeing clases
- 2) A 6-year investment programme in our sport's pitches, supported by Football Foundation.
- 3) Installation of new climbing equipment in junior play area.
- New flat roof to changing rooms area and upweighted maintenance programme across the site.
- 5) Introduction of "The Festival of Christmas"
- 6) Two dedicated mental health practitioners operating from the Tranquility Room and a Women's Wellbeing group.












Financial Review

Our Cash Position is Stable

The charity now has a healthy cash position.


There are now sufficient funds in place to satisfy current and future liabilities, specifically to cover the required reserve requested by the Charity Commission.

EVRT is now able, with potential funding support, to invest in existing and new facilities.




The Make-Up of our income in 2023 is more diverse.

- Grants are increasing and now make up 18% of income
- "Other" income is also increasing, generated by improved use of the facilities in terms of licenses and strengthening the significant community partnerships with local sports clubs, schools and other village groups.
- EPC share has decreased almost 10% points in the last 3 years



Income is rising and more sustainable.


- "Other income" (from funding applications, licenses and user revenue) is slowly increasing.
- Significant grants were secured in 2023/24, with the aim to continue in this manner.
- A broader base of income.




Rising income allows reinvestment in critical upgrades to the facility

Repairs and regeneration of existing facilities is now a priority.

- Expenditure on ground maintenance such as clearing paths and hedges has increased.
- Major repairs to roofs have been undertaken.
- 2023/24 has seen a large increase in costs across all services.



2024 Expenditure



Maintaining fit for purpose grounds and hall facilities incurs the largest proportion of our costs.

The overall expenditure for 2023/24 was supported via grants obtained from Football Foundation and Surrey County Council 'Your Fund'.


What the Parish Council Funding Delivers

- Community club rooms for organised groups to meet and socialise

- Outdoor and Indoor space for community celebrations





















Challenges & Opportunities

- 1 in 4 residents come to the KGV to use the playground – need more higher quality opportunities for informal play & games
- 1in 10 residents struggle to gain access & there are currently no inclusive facilities
- Families express concern about dogs but dog walking is a popular pastime at the KGV
- There is latent demand for more indoor activities and outdoor events




Looking Ahead to Key Projects in 2024/25

 - Free for community use post school and at weekends




Accessible Terrace and Paths for 2024/25

- Inclusive Access gate

- Accessible pathways to connect gate to main activity areas of the grounds.
